-The literal meaning of something




= Rose, flower, plant


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<u>Symbols</u>


Examples in my composition:

Inspiration

Inspiration: Hope by NF

He goes on to list ways he's seen hope in his career and acknowledges that he regrets some things. He tells about the baggage he carries around and looks outward to others for validation. He describes all of the pain that he could've avoided if he had let these things go and started the process to heal.




Inspiration: Intro III

"Intro III" is a song that portrays a struggle between the artist and his fear/anger. The leading voice is the aggressive and manipulating voice of fear. This voice is lying to him and saying that there is no way out, that he'll never be strong enough to finally get rid of fear's strong hold on his thoughts. Gradually, throughout the song, the artist fights back and eventually buries the voice of fear in the back of his mind. He alludes to the fact that fear may make its way back into his life, but there's hope because the artist realizes that he has the keys to the prison he thought he was trapped in.


